Creation

- Often referred to as entrepreneurship or, more accurately, (small) business development
- Community roles
 - Provide a supportive entrepreneurial climate
 - Training and technical assistance available
 - One-stop Permit Center
 - Capital Sources (debt and equity financing)
 - Small Business Incubator (be entrepreneurial)



Attraction

- Activity most associated with econ development
- Most effective strategies target specific sectors/types of business; no shotgun approach
- Location factors include:
 - Markets
- Labor
- Raw Materials

- •Transportation •Industrial Site •Utilities
- •Financial Capital •Other factors



Retention and Expansion

- Many types of retention and expansion programs; most common is firm visitation
- Immediate follow-up with Red and Green flags
- Builds lasting relationships with local firms
- Assessment of business needs and opportunities
- Direct response and assistance to firms and sectors
- Company-specific and industry-specific answers

- Home based/Micro businesses
- Main Street Revitalization
- Manufacturing
 - Light/Light-Medium
 - Heavy-Medium/Heavy
- · Retiree recruitment
- Tourism development
- Professional services




Economic Development Strategies

- Recruited companies must raise average wage
- Workforce prep programs (work ethic, soft skills, reading, basic math) starting in elementary school
- Pay attention to aesthetics don't be an ugly community with nothing to do
- Housing improvement programs
